

What is DEBT? Debt isn't a conventional theater production—it's not a production at all, in fact. A student ensemble will lead a series of four town hall meetings exploring the topic of student debt using participatory, popular theater techniques and facilitation methods to generate dialogue among audience and cast members. Admission is free for the Debt town halls. Attendees are asked to bring non-perishable food items that will be used for a food shelf that the Fighting Poverty at Augsburg group plans to open on campus in the spring semester.
