College graduates (including May 2014 graduates) are warmly invited to apply for a one-academic-year Internship at UIC. Applications for the Intern position must be completed and submitted to UICs International Development Office (international@uic.edu.hk) no later than February 14, 2014.

Requirements for the Application include:

- 1. Successful completion of a Bachelor's degree in any relevant programme.
- 2. A full transcript of academic work completed with a minimum overall GPA of 3.0.
- 3. Two letters of recommendation from academic staff supporting the application.
- 4. A full personal resume including an indication of which UIC position the applicant is applying for. This should detail what specific programme is of interest to the applicant, within the majors offered at UIC. The applicant should articulate the skills and experience he/she would bring to this specific UIC academic programme. General Education is also a viable academic area in which to pursue an Intern position. Rease see the following website for more information on the academic curriculum at UIC: http://uic.edu.hk/en/

Compensation for the Intern position at UIC:

- 1. A monthly housing allowance (RWB1000, to be used, for example, for shared apartments with other TAs in Horizon Cove) will be granted; health insurance; and a round-trip economy airplane ticket from the applicant's home country to China of up to RWB11,000 (\$1,800 US) on a reimbursement basis (reimbursement for the return ticket from China back to the applicant's home country is given upon successful completion of the contract) and ferry or bus fare from the airport to Zhuhai.
- 2. A monthly stipend of between RMB 5000 (\$790 US) and RVB 6000 (\$950 US) is paid from assumption of duties in August/September through the end of June. During this period, Interns must be involved in assigned duties and organizing activities (see requirements and responsibilities of Interns below).
